Did you know . . . ?

- The 2002 FIFA World Cup in Japan and Korea was the first World Cup in history to be hosted by two countries.
- A total of 2,705,197 attended the 64 games – that's an average 46,269 fans per match.
- Brazil won the tournament defeating Germany 2-0 in the final. However it was Germany's veteran goalkeeper Oliver Kahn who won the 'Golden Ball' award for player of the tournament.

Can you . . .

- Calculate the goal difference between all of the teams in England's Group?
- Can you count the total amount of goals your team scores during the tournament?
- Read the schedule of matches and understand all the kick-off times including time differences?
- Read and understand match reports on the internet and in newspapers?

According to the records there were a massive 161 goals scored in total throughout the 2002 tournament's 64 games.

Q: Using this information can you calculate how many goals on average were scored per game?

Between the two countries the stadium with the biggest capacity was the International Stadium in Yokohama, Japan that could hold 72,327. And the stadium with the smallest was the Jeju World Cup Stadium in Seogwipo South Korea which held 36,800.

Q: What is the difference in total numbers of people that can be held in the stadiums?

During the tournament England had their shooting boots on! Over the 5 matches played they registered a total of 30 shots on target.

Q: If England registered 10% more shots on goal at the next World Cup tournament how many more shots would that be?
